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Dear Confreres, members of the Salesian family and friends,

Prayer has always been a key factor of Don Bosco's life and apostolate. His entire mission and work centered around his love of the Eucharist and devotion to our Lady Help of Christians. Love for young people and prayer went side by side and this has been explicitly expressed in the Constitutions: "Docile to the Holy Spirit, Don Bosco lived an experience of humble, trusting and apostolic prayer in which praying and living were spontaneously united. We learn from him to recognize the action of grace in the lives of the young; we pray for them so that the design of the Father may be fulfilled in each of them, and we pray with them that we may witness to our own faith and share the same hope of salvation. Salesian prayer is joyful and creative, simple and profound. It lends itself to community participation and flows from and into life experience." (C.86 & R. 77).

DON BOSCO AND PRAYER

Don Bosco was human and divine. He dedicated his life to the education and spiritual formation of young people, especially those who were marginalized and at risk. Prayer played a central role in Don Bosco's life and in the Salesian Congregation. He believed that prayer was essential for one's personal relationship with God and for the success of his mission. He encouraged his followers to cultivate a deep and vibrant prayer life, which he considered the foundation of our spiritual journey.

In the Salesian Congregation, prayer is seen as a vital aspect of the Salesian Charism and Spirituality. Salesians are encouraged to develop a personal and communal prayer life that integrates contemplation and action, spirituality and apostolate. The goal is to foster an intimate union with God and to be transformed by His grace.

The Salesian tradition promotes various forms of prayer, including liturgical prayer, meditation, personal reflection, and devotion to Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Don Bosco had a profound devotion to Mary under the title of Help of Christians and encouraged others to entrust ourselves to her maternal care.

Salesians are also inspired by Don Bosco's teaching that work, when done with a spirit of love and dedication, can be a form of prayer. We strive to sanctity our daily activities and engage in our work a sense of mission and service to others.

It provides its members with spiritual resources and practices to nurture our prayer life. We have specific times for communal prayer, such as morning and evening prayers, the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, the Adoration, the Holy Rosary, and the recitation of the Liturgy of the Hours. Retreats and spiritual exercises are also organized to help us deepen our relationship with God.

In addition to personal and communal prayer, the Congregation emphasizes the importance of accompanying young people in their spiritual journey. We aim to be spiritual guides and mentors, offering guidance, support, and encouragement to young people as they grow in their faith.

Prayer is a fundamental aspect of the Salesians, rooted in Don Bosco's own spirituality. It is seen as a means to encounter God, seek His will, and find inspiration and strength to live out the Salesian mission of educating and evangelizing young people.







- A. Meditation and Contemplation: Mediation and Contemplation was indeed very important for Don Bosco and he recognized its significance in the spiritual life of individuals, including his own. Here are a few reasons why meditation and contemplation held such importance for Don Bosco:
 - 1. **Encounter with God:** Don Bosco believed that meditation was a way to enter into a deep and personal relationship with God. Through silent reflection and contemplation, one could open his heart and mind to encounter the presence of God and listen to His voice. For Don Bosco, meditation was a means of developing intimacy with God and growing in spiritual communion with Him.
 - 2. Discernment of God's Will: Don Bosco considered meditation as a vital practice for discerning God's will in one's life. He believed that by quieting one's mind and focusing on God's presence, individuals could better understand the direction and purpose God had for us. Through meditation, Don Bosco sought guidance and clarity in making decisions and carrying out our mission.
 - 3. Spiritual Growth and Virtue Formation: Don Bosco recognized that meditation was a powerful tool for personal growth and the cultivation of virtues. By reflecting on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, individuals could internalize His example and strive to imitate His virtues. Don Bosco encouraged his sons to meditate on the Gospel and apply its teachings to their daily lives, fostering spiritual growth and transformation.
 - 4. Inner Strength and Resilience: As Don Bosco dedicated his life to the service of young people, he understood the challenges and difficulties they faced. He believed that meditation, individuals could find solace, peace, and the necessary spiritual strength to persevere in their faith and mission.
 - 5. Union of Heart and Mind: Don Bosco emphasized the importance of integrating one's heart and mind in prayer and meditation. He encouraged his sons to engage not only our intellect but also our emotions and affections in meditation. Don Bosco believed that by uniting the heart and mind, individuals could develop a holistic spirituality that encompassed both rational understanding and emotional devotion.

Meditation was a key element in Don Bosco's spiritual life and was essential for his personal relationship with God, discernment, spiritual growth, and resilience. He considered it a means to encounter God, seek His will, and grow in virtue, and he encouraged others to embrace this practice as well.

- **B.** Effects of Being with God: Don Bosco said that, when we are always with God, there are several positive results and effects that can be experienced in our lives. Some of the key outcomes that Don Bosco believed that would arise from a close relationship with God:
 - 1. Holiness and Sanctity: Don Bosco believed that being in constant union with God leads to holiness and sanctity. By cultivating a deep and continuous awareness of God's presence, individuals can be transformed by His grace and become more like Him in our thoughts, words, and actions. Don Bosco saw holiness as the ultimate goal of the Christian life and believed that constant communion with God was the path to achieving it
 - 2. **Joy and Peace:** Don Bosco taught that being united with God brings a profound sense of joy and inner peace. When we remain connected to God, we experience His love, comfort, and guidance, which can fill our hearts with a deep and lasting joy that transcends worldly circumstances. Don Bosco encouraged his sons to find our joy and peace in God and to share that joy with others.







- 3. Guidance and Direction: Don Bosco believed that when we are always with God, we receive His guidance and direction in our lives. By staying connected to God through prayer, meditation, and reflection, individuals can discern His will and receive the wisdom and insights necessary for making choices and decisions. Don Bosco himself sought God's guidance through constant prayer and believed that God would lead and direct him in his mission.
- 4. Strength and Perseverance: Don Bosco recognized that life can be filled with challenges, difficulties, and temptations. However, he believed that when we are always with God, we receive the strength and perseverance to face and overcome these obstacles. By relying on God's grace and trusting in His providence, individuals can find the resilience and courage to endure hardships and remain faithful to our calling.
- 5. Fruitfulness in Mission: Don Bosco taught that when we remain close to God, we become effective instruments of His love and grace in the world. By living in constant communion with God, individuals are empowered to fulfill our mission and serve others with compassion, dedication, and zeal. Don Bosco himself experienced great fruitfulness in his work with young people, which he attributed to his close relationship with God.

Don Bosco tells us, being always with God leads to holiness, joy, peace, guidance, strength, and fruitfulness in our lives. He believed that maintaining a constant awareness of God's presence and cultivating a deep relationship with Him would bring about transformation and effectiveness in our ministry among the young people.
