THE VISIT OF FR. SILVIO ROGGIA

The Salesian Province of Shillong (INS) was blessed with a visit by Rev. Fr. Silvio Roggia, the General Councilor for Formation. After animating the Five-Day Meeting of the South Asian Formation Commission (SAFC) in Goa, he made his maiden visit to Shillong province after being elected as the Formation Superior though he visited earlier with the formation team. Fr. Silvio was in the province from 6 to 9 August 2025.

We thank God for the gift of Fr. Silvio Roggia as the General Councillor for Formation and we specially thank him for choosing Shillong Province to be among the first provinces to visit extensively after assuming office.

Fr. Silvio Roggia arrived at the Provincial House on 6 August 2025 (Wednesday) at about 6:00 pm. In a happy coincidence, the Provincial Council was having its monthly meeting on the same day. Thus at 7:00 pm he addressed the council members. In his short address, he spoke mainly on three areas: (1) the synergy of the Salesian life and apostolate; (2) the Salesians represent the Church in the world; and (3) the Salesian life as a communion in diversity. The members had sometime for interaction.

After the holy Rosary, he gave the goodnight talk to the whole community. There was a solemn welcome before supper since the council members were having meeting when he arrived.

On 7 August 2025 (Thursday), Fr. Silvio was in Sacred Heart Theological College (SHTC), Mawlai for the Inauguration of the Academic Year 2025-26. He was the main celebrant for the holy Eucharist. After the holy Mass he was present for the solemn inaugural programme where His Grace, Most Rev. Victor Lyngdoh, Archbishop of Shillong was the Chief Guest. At about 3:00 pm Fr. Silvio visited Don Bosco Museum and concluded with tea in the Museum itself. At about 5:00 pm, he met and interacted with the student brothers of

SHTC and at 6:15 pm he met the staff of the same community. After dinner he returned to Provincial House.

On 8 August 2025 (Friday), Fr. Silvio began his journey to Don Bosco Aspirantate at Nonglakhiat in Ri-Bhoi District at 6:00 am. He celebrated the Holy Mass; and after breakfast, he addressed and interacted with the aspirants. After meeting the boys, he addressed and interacted with the confreres of the community which was followed by lunch.

After lunch Fr. Silvio travelled to Upper Shillong where he visited the Generalate and the Novitiate of the Visitation Sisters of Don Bosco (VSDB), one of the members of the Salesian Family. At about 4:00 pm he addressed the Novices of the VSDB Sisters.

The Novices at Sunnyside were eagerly waiting for Fr. Silvio's visit. The latter arrived at about 5:30 pm and began his interaction with them. He joined the evening prayer, dinner and night prayer with the novitiate community. He gave them goodnight talk and returned to Provincial House for the night rest.





On 9 August (Saturday), Fr. Silvio celebrated the Mass for the community of Provincial House and the school Principals who were present for their two-day meeting. During the homily he shared his reflection on the roles of the Salesians in the educational setup. After breakfast he went to Pastoral Centre where we have our Aspirants who completed their Class XII and above.

The Visitor reached Pastoral Centre at 8:30 am and addressed the aspirants. At 9:30 am he left for Salesian Training Centre (STC) to meet the student brothers doing college studies. After a short meeting and interaction, he proceeded to Savio Juniorate, Mawlai.



Savio Juniorate, Mawlai is the Apostolic School with over 180 boys. Fr. Silvio arrived at about 10:00 am and the boys gave him a solemn welcome with songs, a choir and band pieces. He then addressed and interacted with the apostolic boys which was followed with a meeting with the confreres of the community. He took lunch with the community and then returned to Provincial House.

At 3:00 pm of the same day, the Visitor left for Bellefonte, the Novitiate of the FMA Sisters. He met the novices at Bellefonte and had tea with them. Fr. Silvio then visited the Novices at Mawroh who belong to the Missionary Sisters of Mary Help of Christians (MSMHC) Congregation, another member of the Salesian Family. After a short interaction with them, he returned to Provincial House.

He joined the community for evening prayer, spiritual reading, the Rosary prayer, supper and gave them his last goodnight talk. He thanked the community and the province for the hospitality he received and encouraged everyone to keep up with the Salesian life and apostolate.

On 10 August (Sunday), after a light breakfast at 6:00 am, he left for Amguri which is the Prenovitiate house of Dimapur province (IND). Fr. Deli Kapani, the Vice Provincial of Dimapur, had come on the previous day to fetch Fr. Silvio.

DIACONATE ORDINATION AT SHTC =

Wenty-four young men were ordained on 1 July as deacons for the Catholic Church in India during a solemn liturgical ceremony held at the Sacred Heart Theological College Shrine in Shillong. His Grace, Most Rev. Bernard Laloo, DD, Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Shillong, presided over the ordination.

Among the newly ordained are 21 members of the Salesians of Don Bosco and three from the Third Order Regular (TOR), all of whom have completed years of spiritual, theological, and pastoral formation in preparation for their ministry.

During his homily, Bishop Bernard Laloo emphasized the sacred responsibilities entrusted to the diaconate, describing the deacon as one who



serves at the altar, proclaims the Word of God, and lives a ministry of charity. "The Deacon stands as a bridge between the Sanctuary and the world — proclaiming the Gospel, preparing the Sacrifice, and offering a visible witness of Christ the Servant," he said.

The ordination Mass included rich liturgical and cultural elements, reflecting the diversity of the Church in India. The newly ordained deacons publicly expressed their gratitude to parents, formators, superiors, and the many individuals who supported their journey.

As the Church faces growing challenges in fostering vocations, the ordination of these 24 deacons is seen as a hopeful sign for the future. They now step into ministry with a commitment to serve God's people through humility, compassion, and missionary zeal.

ADIEU TO FR. ZEPHYRINUS BAXLA

The Province of Shillong is deeply saddened by the passing of Fr. Zephyrinus Baxla, who left for his eternal reward on 7 July 2025 at Loordippa, Jharkhand. His funeral took place on 9 July 2025 in the same place.

We express our heartfelt gratitude to Fr. Davis Maniparamben, the Provincial of Delhi, and to all the confreres—especially the Salesian community of Kereng—for their fraternal support and care during Fr. Baxla's illness. Their readiness to assist and their warm hospitality were a true expression of Salesian brotherhood. Special thanks are due to Fr. Valerius Lakra, Rector and Parish Priest of Kereng, and to Fr. Jeevan Lakra, Vice Provincial, for their thoughtful arrangements for the funeral.



As we grieve the loss of our dear confrere, we also give thanks to God for the many blessings He worked in and through the life of Fr. Zephyrinus Baxla. His was a life of faith, commitment, and tireless dedication to the poor, the marginalized, and especially to the Adivasi people and their cultural identity.

Fr. Baxla was born on 12 August 1951 in Anabiri village, Rajawal Parish, Jharkhand. He was the second among seven children of the late Mr. Benjamin Baxla and Mrs. Susanna Ekka. From a young age, he felt called to religious life and joined the Apostolic School in Gumla in 1967. He continued his formation at Savio Juniorate, Mawlai from 1968 to 1972, and entered the Novitiate at Sunnyside, Upper Shillong in 1972. He made his First Profession on 24 May 1973.

After completing his Philosophy at Christ King College, Shillong in 1975, he did his Practical Training at Savio Juniorate from 1975 to 1977. He pursued Theology at Sacred Heart Theological College (SHTC), Shillong from 1978 to 1981, making his Final Vows in Dibrugarh on 11 May 1979, and was ordained a priest on 31 December 1981 in Rajawal.

As a young priest, Fr. Baxla was sent to Rome for specialization in Biblical Studies, where he earned a Ph.D. Upon returning, he taught Scripture at SHTC, Shillong. His colleague, Fr. Varghese Palatty, fondly recalled:

"As a professor, he refused to take the scholarly position, but challenged his students to consider the consequences of what they learned. Like the prophetic literature he taught, he encouraged everyone to be a prophet. His classroom was never just a place of instruction—it was a space of inspiration."

Beyond his intellectual brilliance, Fr. Baxla's life was marked by his deep compassion for his people, especially the poor and the marginalized. He not only recognized their needs but also upheld their dignity. From 1996 onwards, he devoted himself to the Bhagitoli region, offering pastoral and social assistance. Alongside his teaching responsibilities, he tirelessly worked for the revival and promotion of Adivasi language and culture in Jharkhand.

Born into humble beginnings, Fr. Baxla chose the path of the Gospel—a life of service, solidarity, and sacrifice. He became more than a priest; he was a true father to the tribal Adivasi communities. He walked with them, listened to their struggles, defended their dignity, and celebrated their heritage. He believed that evangelization and cultural affirmation go hand in hand.

In times when indigenous identities were often silenced, Fr. Baxla stood firm—reviving the Kurukh language, fostering tribal pride, and rekindling a sense of belonging rooted in faith, tradition, and language. Yet, his mission was not only about preserving culture; it was about building a future. Through decades of educational service, he raised generations of young people who found in his schools not just learning, but hope. His classrooms became spaces of liberation, his presence a light in forgotten places.

His ministry was grounded in reality—never distant, never detached. He was not afraid to speak truth to power, nor to get his hands dirty for the sake of justice. Since 2019, he spent most of his time at Loordippa, Bhagitoli, where his passion for the Kurukh language and culture continued to burn brightly.

In July 2024, when his health declined, he was urged to return to Shillong for treatment. Yet, he chose to remain with his people, preferring their company and love to comfort and care elsewhere. It was among them that he breathed his last—a shepherd who never abandoned his flock.

To the Salesian family, Fr. Zephyrinus Baxla was a brother who embodied Don Bosco's dream—a priest close to the young, to the poor, and to those on the peripheries. To the Church in Jharkhand, he was a pioneer of inculturation, a man of pastoral courage and unwavering faith.

May his legacy continue to live on—in every child who reads Kurukh, in every youth who dares to dream, and in every village where hope still burns because one man believed in their worth.

May his soul rest in the peace of Christ.

Exposure visits to Don Bosco Ashalayam and Snehalaya gave participants practical insights into successful YaR interventions.

The event also featured a research report launch on Adverse Childhood Experiences, followed by certificate distribution and a cultural outing, Delhi Darshan. Inspired by the sessions, participants returned with renewed commitment to lead, defend, and serve vulnerable youth across India.
